Saab's Newest Products at Eurosatory 2022

Saab will be exhibiting at Hall 6, Stand H368 from 13-17 June at the Eurosatory defence exhibition, Nord Villepinte Exhibition Centre, Paris. Visitors are welcome at the stand to see and learn more about Saab's newest technologies and solutions that keep users one step ahead on the modern battlefield.

Favoured by many armed forces, **NLAW**, **AT4** and **Carl-Gustaf®**, which recently secured its 15th customer for the latest M4 version, will be available to handle. Demonstrated in May 2022 to over 30 nations, visitors can come and discuss Carl-Gustaf's new **HE 448** programmable ammunition and **Fire Control Device 558**.

Saab will hold a press briefing on **DeployNet**, announced in February 2022, which bridges the military and crisis management domains. When mobile communications are unavailable, DeployNet gives the user the ability to establish rapidly a secure, high bandwidth, ruggedised, scalable 5G/LTE wireless network.

The DeployNet press briefing will be at the Saab stand on **Wednesday 15 June, 11:00-12:00** and all registered media are welcome although places will be limited to 10 participants.

Revealed in May 2022, the **Sirius Compact** passive sensor will be shown for the first time at a global exhibition; its low size, weight and power brings greater flexibility and situational awareness to users who wish to remain undetected on the EW battlefield.

The lightweight **Giraffe 1X** 3D radar and unjammable **RBS 70 NG** air defence system will be on the stand at Eurosatory. Both are at the core of Saab's vehicle-based MSHORAD system that was unveiled in its finalised version in March 2022.
